Looking to the year ahead, we are preparing to launch a new project on Victoria's Patho Plains, focused on the Plains-wanderer. This grassland bird is so unusual it has no close relatives anywhere in the world, and it is now fighting for survival as its habitat disappears. Building on a strong history of conservation practices in this productive landscape, we are working closely with landholders to design and deliver a new solution. A solution that is good for the herd and good for the bird. Stay tuned — we can't wait to share more of this

PROJECT UPDATES

At **Artemis Station**, your support helped create new sanctuary habitat for the endangered Golden-shouldered Parrot, protect nests, restore critical grasslands, maintain year-round feeding stations, and remove feral pigs threatening habitat and breeding success.

At **Chidna Station**, we continued monitoring the endangered Carpentarian Grasswren and undertook important research into the elusive Purple-necked Rock-wallaby, helping guide future protection of these little-known species and the landscapes they depend on.

And in one of the year's most exciting discoveries, our **Night Parrot** acoustic monitoring program confirmed the species at a second remote Queensland location more than 150km from the only previously known population — a major step forward for one of Australia's rarest birds.

Sue Shepherd's work on Artemis Station spans decades and is shaped by a deep understanding of country, gained through long experience, close observation and a

willingness to learn. From the outset, Sue recognised that protecting the endangered Golden-shouldered Parrot did not have to come at the expense of running cattle.
